## The 2017 Missouri Bluebird Conference will feature Bob & Judy Peak

#### "White Bluebird Eggs" & "Curiosities in the Bluebird World"

Volunteers extraordinaire from Kentucky, Bob and Judy Peak are retired Indiana public school teachers who have monitored and managed extensive bluebird trails on public lands in western Kentucky and Tennessee for the past 27 nesting seasons. The Peaks currently have 230 bluebird nest boxes within Land Between the Lakes National Recreation Area and Lake Barkley State Resort Park, close to their home in Cadiz, Kentucky. They have documented over 32,000 Eastern Bluebird fledglings, as well as other bird species. Bob & Judy have been members of the North American Bluebird Society since 1990 and members of the Missouri Bluebird Society since 2011. #### "Birds as Educational Tools"

Directors of the Missouri River Bird Observatory, Dana, Ethan and their staff conduct education and outreach throughout Missouri, in both formal and informal applied settings. Each year they participate in approximately 70 educational events, as well as conducting bird monitoring on thousands of acres within Missouri's most imperiled habitats. They work with the land managers and landowners to further understand specific effects of birds. MRBO presents programs for all levels of education, with the motto: "A Bird in the Hand is Worth More Than Two in the Bush...for Learning!
